Another Lottery Win!

Well, not quite, but we have been successful once again in securing funding from the National Lottery for improvements to our facilities. The eagle-eyed amongst you will have seen that we now have a bank of solar panels on the trading hut. These should provide us with a more stable source of power, without having to resort to a noisy generator and regular use of gas for our working parties and social events. The Association really is committed to α greener, sustainable, environment and we will tell you more of our plans in the new year.

We would also like to mention that the solar installation, and some associated electrical work, was undertaken by a small, newly established, Surrey based company Rolland Turner Renewables, who had been recommended to us by one of our plot holders. Composted Manure

Our next delivery of bagged compost will be in the New Year. As the price has remained the same for some years, it is quite possible that there will be a price increase from 1st January. However, the supplier has undertaken to maintain the current price for any orders we place before Christmas, so we are now taking orders.

If you would like to order any @ £4 per bag or £11 for 3 bags, please let us know and we will reserve them for you.

Payment will not be required until the time of delivery.

Woodchip and Stable Manure

We are expecting further deliveries of both woodchip and manure in the near future, subject to the condition of our main pathway. We do make a small payment to both suppliers to offset some of their delivery costs (including the ULEZ charge), but it is entirely free to plot holders. You will now find a manure fork in the adjacent mower enclosure to help with loading.

Plot Availability

For the first time in our memory, there is no longer a waiting list for a

The Bonfire Plot

Within days of opening the bonfire plot, we accumulated a huge pile of wood and tree prunings, etc which was burned by one of our working parties on 5th November. We are pleased to say that on this occasion, we did not find other rubbish or green waste left on the site.

The bonfire site is currently closed while we have some maintenance work undertaken around the community shed (more about that in the New Year), but we will re-open the site after the work has been completed - probably at the beginning of December. It will then close for the season at the end of February.
